

REV Graduation Requirements

-Social Science 3 years (30 Credits)

World History, U.S. History, Government/Economics

-English 4 years (40 Credits)

-Math 2 years (20 Credits)

Must show successful completion of Algebra 1 or Algebra B even if completed before 9th grade

-Science 2 years (20 Credits)

1 year of life (Biology) and 1 year of physical

-Fine Art or Foreign Language (10 Credits)

1 year of a fine art or a foreign language

-Physical Education (P.E.) (20 Credits)

2 years of PE

-Health (5 Credits)

1 semester

-Electives (80 Credits)

Electives are classes in addition to the 135 credits listed above. Additional Math, Science, PE, Fine Art, and Foreign Language classes can be considered elective units. ROP classes, Work Experience, and other coursework can help reach this goal.

-Pass the California High School Exit Exam (CAHSEE)

Pass the ELA and Math with a score of 350 or higher

****RUSD Board Policy dictates courses required for High School Graduation must be completed within the district.**

Students transferring from other accredited school districts receive credit for completed coursework.

Community College (Crafton, Valley, RCC)

-Students must be 18 or have a high school diploma

-Community College does not require students to take SAT or ACT exams.

-Students planning to attend Community College do not have to retake D's in high school.

-Once enrolled at Community College, students will work with a guidance counselor at that site and develop an academic plan to help them transition to a 4-year University or meet other educational goals.

-Military - requires a diploma; Contact a recruiter

-Athletes – To play college level sports, consult the NCAA Clearinghouse website and work with your coach and counselor to meet requirements

Four Year College Requirements

“A-G” for UC or Cal State

Private College requirements vary

Broad range of admission standards and policies

“A” Social Science: 2 years

1 year of World History and 1 year of U.S. History **or** 1 semester of U.S. History and 1 semester of Government.

“B” English: 4 years

“C” Math: 3 years (4 recommended)

Algebra 1, Geometry, Algebra II. (Other advanced math courses can include Trigonometry, Math Analysis, Calculus, and AP Statistics)

“D” Science: 2 years (3 recommended)

Cal State: 2 years, including one year of biological and one year of physical science with lab

UC: 2 years with lab required, chosen from biology, chemistry, and physics

“E” Language Other Than English: 2 years (3 recommended)

This requirement can be fulfilled through the SAT Subject Exam or with community college coursework.

“F” Visual and Performing Arts: 1 year

Art CP, Digital Art CP, Theater Arts CP, Video Production CP, Sculpture CP, String Ensemble, Wind Ensemble, Concert Choir, AWE, EVS. (This requirement may be fulfilled with classes at the community college level)

“G” College Preparatory Electives: 1 year

Any additional courses that are included on the “A-G” list.

***Grades must be C- or better to fulfill A-G requirements**

Students receiving a D need to re-take the course or consult with their counselor regarding whether or not it can be validated by performing better in a higher level course.

Cal State Minimum GPA is 2.0

Eligibility Index combines GPA and ACT/SAT

UC Minimum GPA is 3.0

Top 9% in each high school may be eligible for UC

***SAT/ ACT exams required for Cal State**

***SAT/ ACT exams required for UC**

***SAT Subject exams no longer required for UC but may be recommended for selective campuses/majors**

***Specialized Academic Instruction (SAI) courses do *not* fulfill “A-G” requirements.**

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
