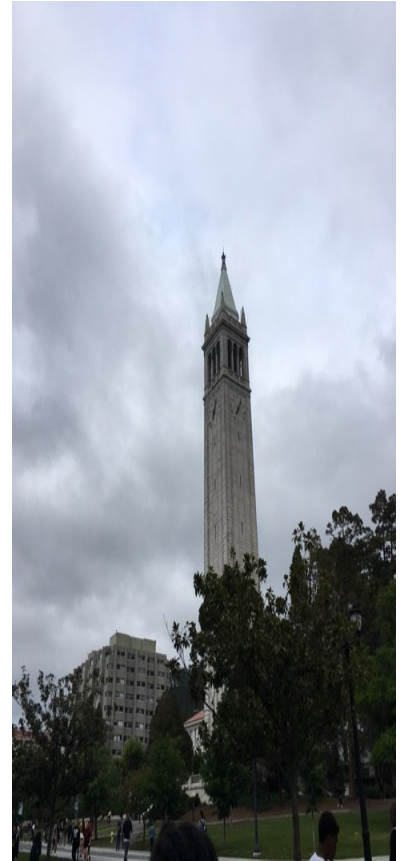
Seniors are looking at their financial packages from colleges, figuring out living situations and sending off their letters of intent to the college of their choice.
